

Caller ID

Caller ID lets you know who's calling before you pick up the phone. You can return important calls when you have time, or simply ignore calls you don't want.

Using Caller ID

- When someone calls, a display attached to your phone shows the name and number of most callers after the first ring.
- The name and number of each caller are automatically stored in memory, even if you're not there to answer.
- If you see UNKNOWN, UNAVAILABLE or OUT OF AREA, the person is calling from an area where Caller ID is not available.
- If you see PRIVATE or ANONYMOUS on your Caller ID display, it means that caller has chosen to block his/her line. You can reject these calls with Anonymous Call Rejection, which is free with Caller ID.

Be aware: A variety of websites and vendors offer services that will let a person make it look like they are calling from any number they want. In this situation, the name or number that displays on the Caller ID or similar equipment may not be the information of the calling party. This is often called "number spoofing." Sometimes it is done for a legitimate purpose, sometimes it is not.

Available in most areas. Compatible telephone or display unit required. Not all calls will display a number and/or name.
